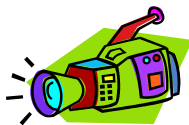
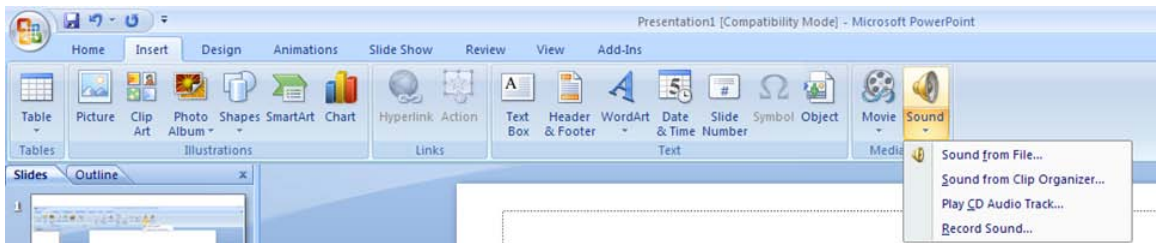

# Making PowerPoint Fun



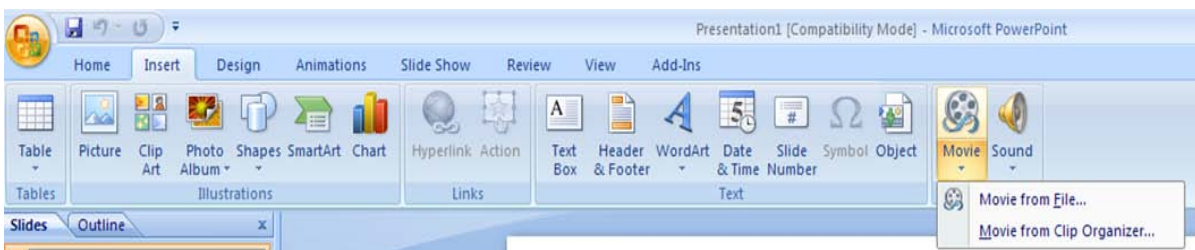
## ADDING AUDIO

- Click on the Insert Tab
- Click on the Sound Icon
- If file is on your computer: Click Sound from File > Select the file on your computer >Click OK
- If you want to use the sound files within Powerpoint: Select Sound From Clip Organizer > search for sound> select OK



## ADDING VIDEO

- Click on the Insert Tab
- Click on the Movie Icon
- If movie is on your computer: Click Movie from File > Select the file on your computer >Click OK
- If you want to use a movie file within Powerpoint: Click Movie From Clip Organizer > search for sound> select OK



## EMBEDDING A WEBSITE

- Click the Insert Tab,
- Click on the HyperLink Icon
- Type or paste the website in the Address line
- Click OK
